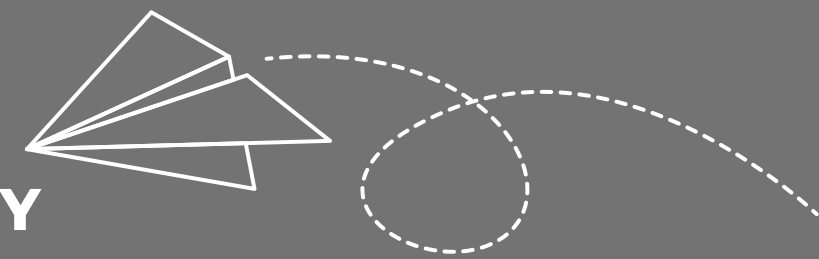

DAY 1

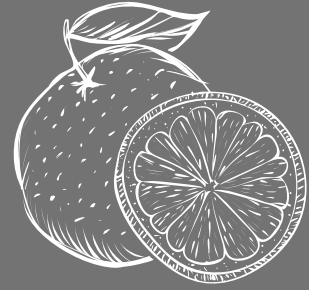
SUNDAY 16 ARRIVAL IN SICILY

DAY 3

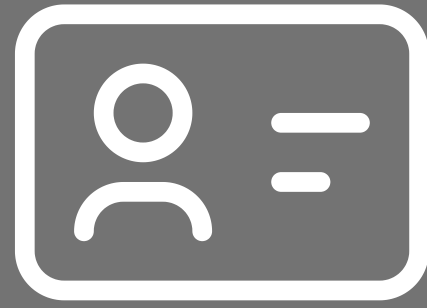
TUESDAY 18

FRIDAY 21



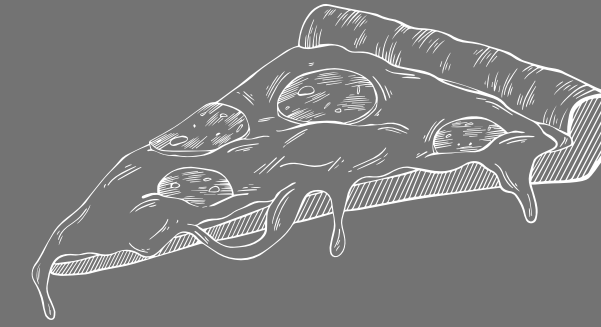
Friday morning we visit Randazzo and its amazing churches and arches. after seeing the town, we went by bus to Catania where we ate and spent the rest of the afternoon.

- After walking and seeing amazing places for a while, we went to have our last Italian pizza of the trip for dinner.

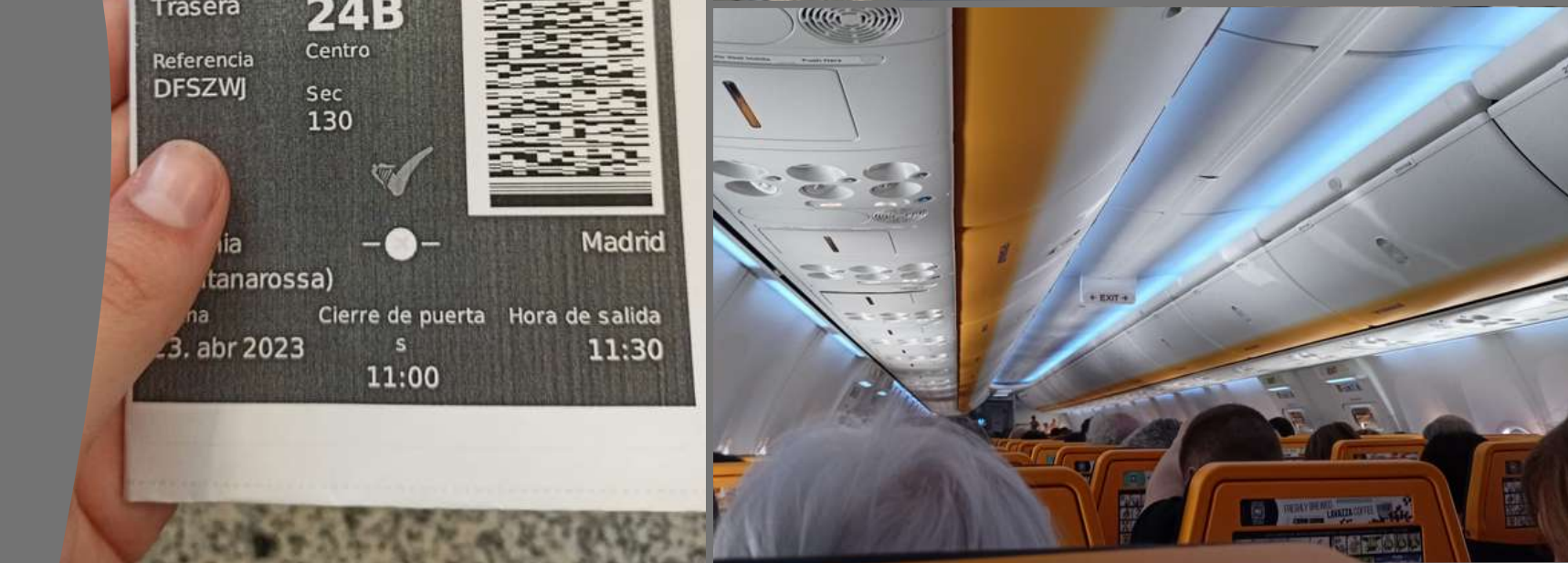
DAY 8
